Dear friends and supporters of Indiana Center for Middle East Peace,

# Thank you for your generous support.

I am writing this on December 15, Day 435 of Israel's genocidal assault on Gaza and the West Bank. It is halfway between December 10, the 76th anniversary of the UN's Universal Declaration of Human Rights, and December 20, the UN's International Day of Human Solidarity (read about it HERE).

I've been saying for the last 14 months that this is not merely a war against Gaza and the West Bank (as awful as that is), this is not merely a war against Palestinian culture and traditions (as terrible as that is), this is not even merely a war against the Palestinian people (as horrific as that is) – it is a war against the very idea of Palestine itself, an attempt to wipe Palestine from human memory.

All while most of the world, most religious organizations and denominations, remain either silent or complicit. And that's true, even more, in the United States, which is not only complicit but criminally active in providing weapons and cover for Israel's crimes against humanity. As Ramallah-based, Palestinian-American businessman, Sam Bahour, recently told me, "This is a US war."

Yet there are some churches, community organizations, Christian, Jewish, and Muslim organizations, in the US and globally, standing in solidarity with Palestinians and other voices of conscience in Palestine and Israel.

2024 marks the 20th anniversary of Indiana Center for Middle East Peace.

We remain "a voice of conscience for peace, justice, human rights, and intercultural encounter."

Below you will read of some of the ways we've tried to remain faithful to our mission this past year, as well as our ambitious plans in our 20-20-20 Campaign for next year.


We invite you to stand with Palestine by continuing to stand with us.



#### "STONES CRY OUT" DELEGATIONS

February-March and September

In February and March at the height of the genocide, Michael led a national delegation of 23 church leaders to Palestine, 17 meetings in eight days.

The delegation then returned to Washington DC for meetings with Congressional members, direct actions, and an interfaith gathering (featuring Rep. Rashida Tlaib). DC coleaders were Doug Thorpe and Mark Braverman.

Throughout the summer, Michael, Mark Braverman, and Doug Thorpe held a series of "Stones Cry Out" webinars (co-sponsored by more than a dozen national pro-Palestine, pro-human rights organizations), culminating in a September delegation to Washington DC

for more meetings with Congressional members, direct actions at the Capitol building and the Democratic National Committee headquarters, and an interfaith gathering.

Following the summer of webinars with Palestinian solidarity activists, September 23-25, Michael, Mark Braverman, and Doug Thorpe led a delegation to Washington DC meeting members of Congress, for two direct actions with **Eli McCarthy** (*Christians for Ceasefire*) at the Capitol Building and the headquarters of the Democratic National Committee, meetings, and an Interfaith Gathering.

- + In May, Michael attended the *Global Anti-Apartheid Conference on Palestine* in Johannesburg, South Africa, attended by activists of 30 countries;
- + Michael continues his work as a member of the Communications Committee with the *Global Kairos Coalition*, in conjunction with *Kairos Palestine*; and as Co-Chair of the ICAHD-USA board;
- + In May, with Rev. Edwin Arrison and Deon Kitching (Embrace South Africa Tours), Michael co-led the "In the Footsteps of Desmond Tutu and Nelson Mandela," focused on the beauty of the culture and landscape, the strength of the anti-apartheid movement, and lessons drawn from the comparison of South African and Israeli apartheid;
- + With Pastor Peter Martin and Ana Diaz Loucks, re-activated our sister organization, *Michiana Voices for Middle East Peace* in Goshen and Elkhart, IN;
- + Began a partnership with the Indiana-Kentucky Conference of the United Church of Christ in Indianapolis, with joint programs (Michael on Palestine advocacy, and Rev. Edwin Arrison and Rev. Rene August on South Africa's solidarity with Palestine);
- + Began a partnership with the re-activated Hoosiers for Peace and Justice in the Middle East in Indianapolis;
  - + Meeting with next generation of leaders for ICMEP;
- + Organized and funded a 17-day, 10-city tour in Indiana, Michigan, and Illinois for the "Drumming for Unity and Healing Tour," with Rev. Edwin Arrison, Rev. Rene August, and the *Volmoed Youth Drummers* from South Africa. They brought smiles and joy in each of the cities where they played.

A host of individual contributors, churches, schools, community organizations, donated meals, and more. Grants from Plymouth Congregational Church and the *A. Philip* 

Randolph Institute, and Fort Wayne and Chicago host families: Ron and Jane Caldwell, Todd and Janet Stephenson, Joe and Janet Darvish, John Gardner, Jean Phillips, Rebecca and Jim Reeder, Bill Lambert, and Andrew and Ahnee Conner. - + We have been meeting with Dr. Tony GiaQuinta, Dr. Ron Caldwell, Terry Dougherty, Linda Kerr, and others to bring a young person from Gaza to Fort Wayne for surgery and rehab, with support from a community of care for patient and family;
  - + Made a grant supporting the *Palestine Writes Literature Festival*;
- + Signed **dozens of petitions** condemning Israel's genocide and US government complicity, cutting of aid to UNRWA, supporting the ICJ and ICC rulings, and more (with *Samidoun*, *CODEPINK*, *Adalah*, *Kairos Palestine*, FOSNA, PCAP, AMP, JVP, USCPR, and others);
- + We continue to work with *Playgrounds for Palestine* selling olive oil from farmers in Palestine supporting the building of playgrounds in Jordan, Lebanon, Syria, and throughout Palestine in schools, in refugee camps, and in Gaza.
  - + Joined Apartheid Free Communities;
- + peacequilts continutes to meet weekly on Wednesday afternoons. Many of the quilts made this year will be given to our Mission Partner, the *Multipurpose Community Resource Center* in the old city of Nablus.
- + Michael began planning for 2025's Winter-Spring programs African-American activist and Co-Chair of the *Samuel De Witt Procter Conference*, Rev. Wendell Griffen; *Kairos Palestine*'s Rev. Munther Isaac; Issa Amro from Hebron; screening *The Law & the Prophets* with filmmaker Josh Vis; and collaborating with *Fort Wayne Cinema Center* in screening *From Ground Zero*, an anthology of 22 Palestinian short films, Palestine's official entry for *Best International Film* at the 2025 Oscars.
- + In May 2025, Michael will be leading his **18th "Solidarity Tour"** to Palestine and Israel, this one the strongest and most ambitious of all. And in October 2025, Michael will be coleading with Rev. Edwin Arrison and Deon Kitching their **third "In the Footsteps of Desmond Tutu and Nelson Mandela" tour** of South Africa.
